### Helpful Tips:

- Choose top quality rollers, brushes, and drop clothes for a great paint job and hassle-free clean-up.
- Remove all cabinet knobs and hinges, door knobs, light switch plates and outlet covers, and light fixtures to avoid drips.
- To paint up to or along an edge “cutting in”, paint five strokes perpendicular to the edge then smooth over these strokes with a long, single, vertical stroke starting from the corner .
- When using a roller, paint in a W or M pattern and fill in blanks with a horizontal or vertical zigzag.
- Peel off painter’s tape while paint is still wet to prevent peeling off dried paint.
- Record the color of your paint to ensure color matching for touch-ups or repainting the room.
